BOYS AT TOSCONOVA bumped with SETTLE FOR MEDAL just after the break, was allowed to settle into stride, was guided into the three path departing the backstretch, ranged up when ready nearing the five-sixteenths pole, was put to hand encouragement after turning for home, poked a head in front at the furlong marker, was firmly in control by the sixteenth pole, then had little difficulty fending off his more energetically handled closest pursuer, under light hand urging. STAY THIRSTY stumbled at the break, recovered in short order, moved up willingly on his own courage to grab the early lead, carved the pace towards the inside, with the rider applying rating tactics, and under the watchful eye of WINE POLICE, braced himself for the upcoming assault, being asked for some run in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, was headed with an eighth to go, battled onward under a drive, but proved no match for the confidently ridden winner. WINE POLICE patiently stalked the pacesetter from the outside, well in hand until midway around the turn, issued a challenge for the lead under rousing coming to the five-sixteenths pole, battled gamely as the middle member of a three way stretch tussle during the run through the furlong grounds, failed to keep up and had to settle for the show. SETTLE FOR MEDAL bumped with BOYS AT TOSCONOVA just after the start, hugged the rail under a snug hold until the seven-sixteenths pole, was given a bit of rein in attempt to keep pace with the trio up ahead, was set down to a drive angling into the stretch, but lacked the necessary stretch response.
