By subscription of \$400 each, which should accompany the nomination; \$2,000 to pass the entry box and \$2,000 to start. The purse to be divided 60% to the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fifth and 2% divided equally among remaining finishers. Three year olds, 116 lbs.; Older, 122 lbs. Non-winners of a Grade 1 in 2006 allowed 2 lbs.; a Grade 2 twice in 2006, 4 lbs.; a Grade 1 in 2005 or a Grade 2 in 2006, 6 lbs. Trophies will be pre sented to the winning owner, trainer and jockey. Closed Saturday, August 12, 2006 with 17 Nominations.

FLEET INDIAN opened a clear advantage while angling to the inside on the first turn, set a moderate pace in hand for six furlongs, maintained a clear lead while under wraps on the turn, shook off a mild bid from BALLETTTO when turned loose leaving the quarter pole then drew away with authority under mild right hand encouragement. BALLETTTO (UAE) settled just off the early pace, moved out entering the backstretch, was unhurried while three wide for seven furlongs, took up chase after the winner leaving the three-eighths pole, was hard ridden to close the gap a bit approaching the top of the stretch, but was no match for FLEET INDIAN while continuing on well to clearly best the others . SOUL SEARCH was pinched back in tight quarters at the start, trailed while saving ground for seven furlongs, lodged a mild rally along the inside on the turn and lacked a strong closing response. YOLANDA B. TOO stumbled badly at the start then was taken in hand in the early stages, angled outside the winner on the first turn, stalked the pace from outside to the far turn, dropped back midway on the turn and steadily tired thereafter. INDIA HALO (ARG) checked slightly between horses while being crowded soon after the start and never reached contention .
