1 1/8 MILE. (Turf) (1:38²) STAKES. Purse \$200,000 Pilgrim S. (Grade III) FOR TWO YEAR OLDS. By subscription of \$200 each which should accompany the nomination; \$1,000 to pass the entry box and an additional \$1,000 to start. For horses not originally nominated, a supplemental payment of \$1,000 (in addition to the entry and starting fees) can be made at any time prior to the closing of entries. The purse to be divided 55% to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 12% to third, 6% to fourth, 4% to fifth and 3% divided equally amongst the remaining finishers. 122 lbs. Non-winners of a race on the turf other than maiden, claiming or starter allowed 2 lbs.; all maidens allowed 4 lbs. A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. The New York Racing Association reserves the right to transfer this race to the Main Track. In the event that this race is taken off the turf, it may be subject to downgrading upon review by the Graded Stakes Committee. Closed Saturday, September 14, 2019 with 30 Nominations. (If the Stewards consider it inadvisable to run this race on the turf course, this race will be run at One Mile and One Sixteenth on the Main Track.) (Rail at 27 feet). (Clear 77)

Bay Colt, (Feb), by Palace Malice - Miss Always Ready by More Than Ready. Trainer Chad C. Brown. Bred by Three Chimneys Farm, LLC (KY).

STRUCTOR away well, settled in hand just off the pace four wide down the backstretch, tucked three wide half a mile from home and advanced on the top pair stacking outside them three furlongs from home, remained patiently handled coming under light coaxing nearing the quarter pole, swung six wide into upper stretch set down for the drive, took over command with about three-sixteenths to go, inched away under a drive to the eighth pole, dug in under threat to the inside and held gamely to prevail. ANDESITE tracked from just off the inside in aim of the top pair, tucked inside half a mile from home taking up the cover of the leader in the pocket, came under light coaxing nearing the quarter pole, tipped out to the two path and spun just off the inside for home brushing with NO LIME before straightening away, lugged in at the three-sixteenths forcing the weakening TUGGLE to be steadied in tight along the rail, got corrected and offered up a good kick to issue a challenge through the final furlong but missed at the end. OUR COUNTRY settled just off the inside at the tail of the field, tipped out three wide at the three-eighths placed to coaxing, had NO WORD angle out from his inside nearing the quarter pole and got leaned on spinning seven wide into upper stretch before that rival altered inwards straightened away, dug in rallying willingly outside to secure the show honors. FAMISHED three wide near the rear of the field, tipped out four wide half a mile from home and took the overland route through the far turn coming under a ride three furlongs from home, advanced on the front spinning six wide into upper stretch in behind the eventual winner, kept on to procure the last major share. NO WORD settled just off the inside near the rear of the field, remained patiently handled until inside the five-sixteenths, began to tip out nearing the quarter pole, went five to six wide briefly leaning on OUR COUNTRY before tucking five wide into upper stretch, angled in near the eighth pole and threaded his way through the stretch through traffic offering up a mild kick. MAXWELL ESQUIRE a bit fractious in the gate prior to the start, got away forwardly placed and prompted the leader from the outside three wide down the backstretch, tucked to the two path into the turn and came between foes as STRUCTOR ranged up to the outside, got placed to coaxing past the five-sixteenths, took over brief command straightened away three wide for home, got headed with about three-sixteenths to go by the eventual winner and weakened in the final furlong. NO LIME settled tracking just off the pace three wide down the backstretch and then two wide through the far turn coming under coaxing at the five-sixteenths, spun three wide into upper stretch getting brushed along the inside by ANDESITE, then weakened in the drive. THE GRAY BLUR three to four wide in pursuit from mid pack, came under coaxing at the five-sixteenths, swung four wide into upper stretch and weakened. TUGGLE coaxed from the gate, established the front and showed the way in hand along the inside under some pressure from MAXWELL ESQUIRE to the outside, got joined by STRUCTOR three deep through the turn as the pressure increased and came under coaxing at the five-sixteenths, cut the corner into upper stretch headed for the front, got steadied in tight inside at the three-sixteenths when weakening as ANDESITE lugged in, then continued to weaken through to the finish.
