1 MILE. (1.32<sup>1</sup>) STAKES. Purse \$250,000 *SLEEPY HOLLOW S. FOR TWO YEAR OLDS FOAL*ED IN NEW YORK STATE AND APPROVED BY THE NEW YORK STATE-BRED REGISTRY. By subscription of \$250 each which should accompany the nomination; \$1,250 to pass the entry box and an additional \$1,250 to start. For horses not originally nomi nated, a supplemental nomination payment of \$1,500 along with the entry and starting fees may be made at any time prior to the closing of entries. The purse to be divided 60% to the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fifth and 2% div ided equally amongst the remaining finishers. 122 lbs. Non-winners of a race other than maiden or claiming allowed 2 lbs.; maidens, 4 lbs. A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. Nominations closed Saturday, October 4, 2014 with 14 original nomin ations and 1 supplement. (Cloudy 68)

OSTROLENKA prompted the pace along the inside in hand, took over under his own power at the seven-sixteenths, remained patiently handled as the pressure in behind intensified, spun just off the inside for home let out for the stretch drive, shook away to the eighth pole under mostly a hand drive, came under a off sided stick nearing the sixteenth marker before being switched to the near side inside that station and held safe to the wire. GOOD LUCK GUS just off the pace three wide, came under urging midway on the turn and advanced to issue a challenge nearing the quarter pole, swung three wide for home, got shaken off to the eighth pole, ran on with mild kick to close some ground while garnering the place honors. MARKET CONDUCT three wide towards the rear early on, advanced under encouragement from the five-sixteenths, continued three wide for home, rallied into prominence a furlong out, kicked on belatedly for the show honors. THANK YOU off a beat slow at the start, saved ground towards the rear, got spirited up angled three wide into upper stretch, passed tired rivals in the lane with a mild kick. BULLHEADED BOY brushed the near side stall at the start, chased along the inside in range of the front, came under urging nearing the quarter pole, cut the corner into upper stretch and weakened in the final eighth. BELLAMY WAY chased the pace three to four wide from mid pack under encouragement from the five-sixteenths, angled four to five wide into upper stretch, tired in the drive. BREAKIN THE FEVER cut the pace from just off the inside a bit keen early on while prompted to the inside by the eventual winner, got headed at the seven-sixteenths, came under urging at the five-sixteenths as GOOD LUCK GUS ranged up outside, swung just off the inside into upper stretch losing position and gave way in the lane.
